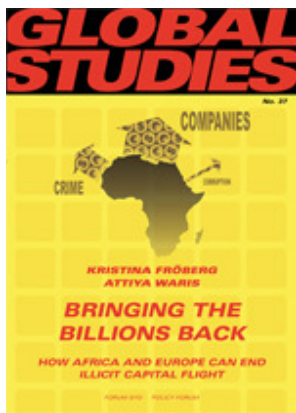


Meet the authors of *Bringing the Billions Back: How Africa and Europe Can End Illicit Capital Flight*

Welcome to a breakfast seminar on September 23 about illicit capital flight from poor countries, how it affects development, and how it can be stopped.



Capital flight has been called “the ugliest chapter in global economic affairs since slavery”. Every year unreported flows of money amounting to as much as ten times the value of global development aid leave poor countries and end up in rich countries and tax havens. Multinational companies evading taxes are responsible for most of this capital flight.

Forum Syd’s new report explains illicit capital flight, how it happens, its magnitude, its consequences for the poor, and measures needed to end it.

- Dr. Attiya Waris, a lecturer at the School of Law at the University of Nairobi as well as an advocate of the High Court of Kenya. Dr. Waris is a member of the OECD Task Force on Tax and Development and vice chair of the Tax Justice Network.
- Moses Kulaba, convener of the Budget Working Group of Policy Forum. Policy Forum is a coalition of over 90 civil society organisations in Tanzania.
- Kristina Fröberg, a political scientist and an advocacy officer at Forum Syd. Forum Syd gathers almost 200 Swedish civil society organisations collaborating for global justice.
