### **Agenda 1: Presentation by Steadman Group of Companies**

The Steadman Group of Companies attempts to analyze media usage in Tanzania (amongst other regions through Africa). Media forms are utilized at different levels; Steadman attempts to monitor this usage and collect data that will allow organizations to identify what the best form of media coverage. Steadman's ongoing project TAMPS (Tanzania All Media and Product Survey) is the research they do annually (as of 2006) in order to get this information to their clients. Steadman's research could be useful to Policy Forum members as it gives all members a concrete answer as to what form of media gets the most coverage, and in addition, what time of day are most users utilizing that form of media.

#### **Questions and Issues raised by Members:**

- Since TAMPS is survey based, and uses an hourly diary to obtain data, the question of literacy was raised, and whether it has an impact on the data.
- Did the survey cover ALL forms of media?
- Would the data received be useful to Policy Forum members specifically?
- Were there any incentives to encourage people to participate?
- The issue of cost was raised, however a verbal statement was made saying that the cost was "negotiable"
- It was stated that this information is important for decision making purposes for different sectors of education, and it would be good to have this information in a systematic format.

### **Agenda 2: Policy Forum Website**

- The website was up and live, the Kiswahili section is in the process of going live as well.
- Members were asked to have a look at the members list and make sure that the information on there was up to date.
- A PF forum has been added on a trial basis where by members can login in and have an open discussion on issues pertaining to PF.
- Members who don't have email addresses can get an email through the Policy Forum website with the policy forum domain.
- Certain suggestions were made to improve the website:
  - It would be useful to add a links section
  - Information on non-voting members to be added as well
  - A different page for the budget working group to upload files and documents, and summaries of past debates
  - It would be useful to have an FAQ section
- An issue was raised regarding having a form of a bulletin board for members wishing to find certain resources. However this relates to another issue raised regarding what the boundaries are for the website. We don't want the site to be a place where all sorts of irrelevant material is shared. The site needs to remain professional and maintain its strategic edge.

### **Agenda 3: Feedback on recent events initiated by the Working Groups**

#### **Budget Working Group**

- The seminar with the Parliamentary Finance and Economic Affairs Committee was successful in increasing understanding with the members of parliament. This would be useful to continue to build and increase the extent of interactions between the parliament and CSOs. This also means that we need to start to build and develop relations with other parliamentary committees.
- PF will continue to try and speak or present in the parliament, however PF needs to be careful of members of parliament becoming involved in the organization. Yet PF should try to target Dar es Salaam based MPs.

#### **Local Government Working Group**

- The LGWG brought up the Local Government Day to be held on July 1<sup>st</sup> 2007, and whether PF would like to hire a tent as an organization. Price per tent was quoted to be TSHS 70,000/- Policy Forum would be interested in having a tent if other members would be interested in sharing the space and cost.
- The LGWG would like to revise their booklets on the local government, and base it on the information received from PMORALG – Hebron to lead this attempt.
- It was discussed that PMORALG had advertised to contact CSOs to have an open dialogue next month with 25 NGOs.
- It was said that the CSOs have a better understanding of the local government. Now we also have a second option with a CD-ROM of information. This CD is to launch on July 4<sup>th</sup> 2007. Information from this can be used to find beneficial points for the CSOs.

#### **Education Working Group**

- The Education Work Group – The 1995 education policy is being reviewed. It was reviewed in 2005 but did not follow the proper channels.
- CCNGO – UNESCO – Secondary data collection
- The Education Watch Initiative was brought up, and its “Education for All” umbrella.
- Mention of the new adult education program
- Education Section Education Plan of Review – Second phase of review
